News Items

It is with great regret that I inform you of the passing of former colleagues and Spartan members.

<u>Mike Gondos</u> succumbed recently after a long struggle with cancer. I visited the funeral home and gave my condolences to his wife Jean, and noted in the guest book that several Spartans had also visited to honour this fine person and good-natured colleague. As **Al Lawson** noted in his notification to members, he was well known, well respected and well liked. I met **Curt Ingerville** as he was leaving, and at 97 seemed as alert as ever.

<u>Tony Luscombe</u> The news from Peter Oswald of Tony's unexpected and untimely death while at work at MDA in Vancouver shocked and saddened all of us. He made critical contributions to the success of Radarsat and earned the respect of his colleagues and his employer. I sent my condolences to his family, friends, and colleagues, and noted that I had the highest regard for his technical ability and his quiet and effective work ethic. His diligence and success in Marathon running also impressed me. It is only coincidental that in the past few days I heard a medical report that endurance sportsmen are often vulnerable.

From his obituary we are reminded that, "Tony left England to join Spar Montreal in 1985 as a Specialist Member Technical Staff. He worked his way up to the position of Staff Scientist and remained with Spar Montreal until October 1998 when he left to join MDA in Richmond BC. Tony was one of the founding members of the Space Missions Group and a major contributor to the success of Canada's RADARSAT programs before moving into GSI to continue his world class work in the field of radar processing. In his position of Principal Engineer of MDA, Tony earned the respect of his colleagues and MDA's customers worldwide".

Eric Lavender From his obituary we are told that "he died in Kitchener at age 67 so his retirement was unfortunately very short. Eric was born in England and apprenticed as a toolmaker at the British Aircraft Corporation in the UK. He then worked in Australia for 2 years before immigrating to Canada in 1967. He lived in Montreal and worked in the manufacturing and aerospace industries for many years. His work provided opportunities for travel abroad, including Indonesia, China, Russia and many European countries. Since moving to Kitchener in 1997 Eric worked for MD Robotics in Brampton, Astrium in the UK, and COM DEV in Cambridge". We will all remember and will miss Eric's robust personality and presence.

Evelyn Feehan From her obituary: "It is with sadness in hearts to announce the passing of Irene Evelyn Feehan on Tuesday, January 11, 2011 at the age of seventy-nine, a caring sister to Margaret Jensen (Peggy) and loving brother to Eamon Feehan. Auntie Evelyn as we affectionately called her was an early role model for women in the workplace, embarking upon a lengthy career at RCA/SPAR where she made numerous lifelong friends. Upon retiring she returned to school and obtained a Bachelor in Fine Arts degree at Concordia in 1989. Her passion for painting and photography also included her involvement in the Dorval Artist Association. Both her Montreal and Boston families will miss her dearly."

"This was the contract signing ceremony for the Pakistan Earth Station Project (East and West before Bangladesh was created) worth some \$12M (in 1970 \$= very big). You may recognize the RCA personnel:

- 1. Rear standing one from left...**Roy Machum** our intrepid sales dept. leader surrounded by his highly effective local agents Mohammed Ahmed on the far left and Naseem Qadir on the right. I learned later that Naseem had some kind of family connection to Yahya Khan the President of Pakistan which probably didn't hurt.
- 2. In the front left seated we have **Tony Lafleur** our legal counsel and **Jack Sutherland** the then G.M. signing with the PTT's O.H. Mohammed, the D.G., and his deputy Mr. Farooqi.
- 3. On the far right we have **Fred Richaur** our pricing expert and separated by Mr. Jamali from the PTT the RCA Project Manager in waiting (myself). The tall PTT man in the middle is Mr Faizi but I can't recall the gentlemen on his right and left.

One memory I have is of Jack picking up his pen, hesitating, then looking over to Fred Richaur and to everyone's embarrassment asking him "You did check this?".....Fred smiled and nodded."

As I recall most of the Europeans knew something of the game (Kees Becker in particular was outstanding) while the Canadian born players were not sure what it was all about and made up with enthusiasm for what they lacked in skills. I don't remember winning any matches against the likes of Rolls Royce and Marconi or, honestly, even scoring any goals. However we did try and greatly enjoyed the post mortem(s) at the local tavern. I believe the photo was taken at Parc Jolicoeur not far from 1001 Lenoir St.

This was brought to mind at the lunch when Henri Claireaux told me that in his younger days he played a few matches with a professional team and wanted to actually be a professional player when he lived in France! The 1960's RCA team lasted a couple of years and then disappeared but was resurrected later on.
